I think whenever one tree is cut down we should plant


five trees to balance the ecosystem.

I am a very bright and positive person and strongly believe that one day I will spread hope to everyone. We must always stay hopeful is life. Belief in self is true power, true hope.








NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY






Category B - DIY Ventilator Won the Overall presentation prize

Virtual sessions began across schools all 'round the globe. Billabong High International School, Andheri joined the bandwagon of starting classes on the virtual platform.
