
VAN MAHOTSAV










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CULMINATING ACTIVITY-JUST MABEL!

WORKSHOP WITH PARENTS





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GRADE IV GOES DESI


Grade IV students took a trip around the different states of India in their EVS class. After learning about the different zones of India, each student was asked to research about the state assigned to them and present how unique is each state.




