

My Trips with Papa to the Geological Wonder Sites of Djibouti, East Africa

The world has many exotic places, which few people know about. Djibouti in East Africa is one such. We recently returned to India after spending two years in Djibouti, where my Papa was working for a Bank. Besides its well-known geo-political significance, Djibouti is a nature lovers' paradise. Situated at the mouth of the Red Sea, Djibouti has appealing long clean sandy beaches, crystal clear blue green sea waters, colorful corals, mangroves, and other magnificent marine life. A unique thing about Djibouti is its prehistoric landscape which is of volcanic origin. There is Lake Abbe, known for its limestone chimneys and Africa's deepest and lowest point at Lake Assal. There is a lot to explore.

On one such trip with Papa, I got to see moving tectonic plates, which form part of the East African Rift system. I was awestruck to see a wide crack among the rocks, which ran for many kilometers across Djibouti, Somalia and Ethiopia.



According to scientists, these two tectonic plates will separate from each other after some million years, leading to the formation of a new continent. These two tectonic plates are moving away from each other at the rate of 6mm every year. Led by a local guide, my Papa and I walked across this geological wonder, which is very windy. Strong gusts of wind make it impossible to wear caps or sunglasses, although the temperature remains high throughout the year. My Papa had removed his sunglasses and kept them in his T-shirt pocket. A sudden gust of wind caused my Papa's sunglasses to fly and fall right in between the two tectonic plates. This was quite funny but dangerous too. At the end of the trip, our driver gave us a long stick kept in his vehicle to remove the sunglasses out. For some time, my Papa's sunglasses were part of two continents. Extremely near to these tectonic plates is Ardoukoba, a volcano which had last erupted in 1978, for almost a week. The lava flow from this volcano has drained to two nearby water bodies, Lake Assal and Lake Ghoubet, and has become igneous rocks. We visited some caves present near to the volcano. We went into them and they are still very hot inside.



Just outside these volcano caves, lies the depression caused by the movement of the tectonic plates. This depression is surrounded by green stuff (must be algae). Out of this depression, hot steam came out. We also saw a big and deep hole inside the volcano cave. It was very deep, and I think it could lead us to the Earth's core!

While going home, I said that I wanted to see Chitons (which I thought were fossils), on the coast of Lake Ghoubet. This is because my parents had not seen them & none of us knew how they looked at that time. Even though I knew Chitons, I thought they were chiton fossils. But there were many crabs here also. When my parents saw the chitons, I figured that the one I saw was a live one. On our way home, as the sky was clear we saw "millions, billions and trillion of stars" shining on our faces. I loved this day which was filled with adventure.


Our preschoolers had a fun time when they got to groove with their favourite Old McDonald at his Party! They experienced farm life and learnt about farm animals.





Students were intrigued by the simple anatomy while doing the X Ray creating activity themselves!

















